## PARTNERING FOR THE FUTURE: ACCESSCNY AND SPAULDING TO FORMALLY MERGE

We are proud to announce the exciting news that AccessCNY and Spaulding Support Services will join forces. The combined agency will serve over 3,200 people with disabilities and operate under the name AccessCNY.

As one agency our programs will be broader, our staff more experienced and our resources richer.

As of January 1 Spaulding became a subsidiary of AccessCNY. In the coming months the agencies will begin to share staff, space and administrative tasks. The two agencies will fully merge in the summer of 2018.

AccessCNY and Spaulding both have strong programs and stable finances and come together proactively. The combined agency will employ over 1,700 Central New Yorkers and have a shared budget of over \$42 million. Together the agencies have provided support to individuals with disabilities for more than 145 combined years.

While we'll be a larger organization, our focus today and always will be on providing the best person-centered

services possible to individuals with disabilities. By growing as one agency we are better prepared to continue this legacy of support as the funding of services for individuals with disabilities changes.

This collaboration was made possible thanks to the hard work and dedication by both organizations' staff and Board of Directors over the last several months. We are also grateful for the Central New York Community Foundation's financial support of this process through their Strategic Partnership Fund.

We look forward to the new possibilities this partnership can offer our community. ۶

#### EMPLOYMENT SUCCESS FOR HEATHER

The Immaculate Conception Church in Fayetteville has a new star employee, Heather Galko. Heather works with an AccessCNY employment consultant, who has helped her find and maintain employment in the community.

Since Heather is blind, she needs certain accommodations at work, and AccessCNY employment consultants like Lynn Root have experience in matching each person's abilities to the right employer.

At the church, Heather runs the listening ministry, which reaches out to parishioners who have trouble making it to services, are recovering from an illness or live on their own and aren't able to get out much. This way, they can maintain contact with the church without having to travel.

In the beginning, Heather struggled to build relationships with those she called. As Root describes it, "At first, she wasn't connecting to those she called. Conversations were short. After we began to work together and practice the calls, Heather learned to better find common ground with those she was talking to, Now, some calls last 20 minutes!'

Late last summer, Heather also started doing home visits with her supervisor at the church. One of her first visits was to an elderly woman who was beginning to lose her eyesight. She had so many questions for Heather. How do you choose your clothes? How do you cook and get groceries? Heather was able to answer all of her questions, and put her at ease. Now, in addition to her calls, Heather does two home visits a month, with more to come!

Simply put, Heather has succeeded. As her supervisor, Elaine LaFollette, Parish Minister at the church puts it, "The recipients of the calls are so appreciative of this ministry and look forward to Heather's weekly call. Heather does a great job; she is a very good listener, detailed-oriented and very conscientious. We at Immaculate Conception Church are very blessed to have her on staff."
